A.	The Ministry of Social Development and Family Services and the Ministry of Finance should collaborate with the Ministry of Digital Transformation to improve their application processes. During an inquiry into Work from Home arrangements in the public service during the pandemic, the Committee became aware of the project works to be executed to effect digitization and digitalization in the public service 2022. We recommend that the digitalization of the manual application process should be prioritised among these projects.	The Ministry of Social Development and Family Services (MSDFS) is currently working with representatives from the Ministry of Digital Transformation (MDT). This collaboration is in the form of the establishment of an Inter-ministerial team such as the Transformation and Change Management Project Office (TCMPO), which is predominantly staffed by MDT representatives. The TCMPO reports to both Permanent Secretaries of the MSDFS and MDT.  The TCMPO has been mandated to have oversight over MSDFS's social protection projects/programmes. Some of the technological projects under the umbrella of the Ministry's Social Protection program are:  SharePoint — Document Management and Workflow of Administrative Records.  Integrated Social Enterprise Management System for Client and Case Management Digitization Project - Digitization of Administrative and Clients' Records Wide Area Network — the channels to facilitate the additional traffic. Also, the new network will facilitate remote access for members of staff to work remotely.

The Ministry of Social Development and Family Services should conduct an assessment of the effectiveness of its communication and feedback strategies inclusive of public views to improve its information dissemination systems and processes. Efforts should be made to complete by the end of the 2 <sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2022.	The MSDFS is currently conducting an Impact Assessment Study on its COVID-19 relief efforts. This assessment will consider any gaps that existed in the Ministry's communication strategies pertaining to its COVID-19 relief. The findings of this study will be used to guide the Ministry's policy review and decision-making
