1. **To the Minister of Health:**

In light of recent reports of an outbreak of foot and mouth disease at the ASJA Boys' Primary School, could the Minister state why there have been no public advisories and measures undertaken by the Ministry to address these reports?

2. **Minister of Energy and Energy Industries:**

Given the decision of the Government to close down the operations of Petrotrin by November 30, 2018, could the Minister inform this House how many former employees of Petrotrin have been re-hired at the Heritage Petroleum Company, Paria Fuel Trading Company and Guaracara Company?
