PRIVATE BUSINESS

Motions:

The debate on the following Motion which was in progress when the Senate adjourned on Tuesday January 29, 2008, will be resumed:

- (i) WHEREAS** there exist in Trinidad and Tobago a privately run security Industry which employs in excess of fifty thousand security guards who are unprecepted;

AND WHEREAS these unprecepted security officers are required to work under conditions which may be inconsistent with the provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA);

AND WHEREAS many guards are remunerated at low rates of pay thereby requiring many to work excessively long hours;

AND WHEREAS there is a need for government to protect the rights of these workers and to guard them against exploitation;

AND WHEREAS the government has not established the necessary standards and regulations to govern the private security industry;

BE IT RESOLVED that the government take all necessary steps to ensure that unprecepted private security guards are not exploited by virtue of the high demand for security services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the government take all the necessary measures to enact into law the relevant legislation to establish the necessary standards and regulations that would govern the private security industry.

- (ii) WHEREAS** Section 4 of the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago provides for all citizens the right to equality of treatment from any public authority in the exercise of any function and the right to equality before the law and the protection of the law;

AND WHEREAS both Houses of Parliament have already passed into law the Equal Opportunities Act;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Government takes immediate steps to have the Equal Opportunity Legislation proclaimed and fully effected in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago.

- (iii) WHEREAS** there are allegations of widespread corruption and mismanagement of the money spent by the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago;

AND WHEREAS there are allegations of a lack of transparency;

BE IT RESOLVED that this Senate call on the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago to account for the manner in which it has conducted the financial affairs of the State and for its failure to take corrective action.

(iv) WHEREAS financial support for election campaigns is necessary for a healthy multi-party democracy;

AND WHEREAS the electorate needs to be satisfied that all viable political parties contest elections under conditions which are fair and transparent;

AND WHEREAS the issue of election financing has been the subject of widespread public concern during the last thirty years in this country;

BE IT RESOLVED that Parliament appoint a Joint Select Committee to consider establishing a legislative framework to govern the financing of election campaigns and to submit its report with recommendations to both Houses of Parliament within six months of its appointment.

QUESTIONS FOR WRITTEN ANSWER

Question No. 1 to the Honourable Attorney General

(By Senator Prof. Ramesh Deosaran)

With respect to the specific offences of robbery, burglary, larceny, abduction, kidnapping, assault, house break-in, possession of drugs and drug trafficking, could the Minister inform the Senate for each of the last four years 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006.

- a. How many times each offence was committed (reported) in each of these years?
- b. How many persons have been charged for each offence in each year?
- c. Of those charged, how many have been granted bail or refused bail in the Magistrate's Court?
- d. Of those refused bail in the Magistrate's Court, how many on appeal have had such bail subsequently granted in the High Court?
- e. Of those granted bail in the Magistrate's Court, how many have had this decision on appeal reversed in the High Court?
- f. Of those granted bail in the Magistrate's Court, or in the High Court, how many have subsequently been charged for one or more of these offences?
- g. What type(s) of offence(s) have they been charged for while out on bail?
- h. Of those charged for each of such offences while out on bail, how many have been convicted?
- i. Of this convicted lot, what type of sentence did they receive?
