Questions for Oral Answer

- (b) of the Government's position as to the efficacy of the measures at (a) above to date, in relation to the companies who have directly gained benefits and the concomitant gains to the state (if any); and
- (c) whether the efficacy of the application of the measures at (a) above are being reviewed, and if so, how often and what reports, etc., have been generated as well as the key findings of such reports (if any exist)?

***Question No. 45 to the Honourable Minister of Energy and Energy Affairs**

Could the Minister advise on the status of the Standing Committee on Energy as it relates to the following:

- (a) the number of meetings held in the years 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 (to date);
- (b) the energy projects that have been the subject of deliberation by the Committee;
- (c) the projects approved for development by the Committee; and
- (d) the major energy policy decisions of the Committee?

Question No. 47 to the Honourable Minister of Energy and Energy Affairs

Could the Minister please advise this Senate on:

- (a) the status of the operations of the Permanent Petroleum Pricing Committee and the number of meetings held in the years 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2103;
- (b) whether the non-functioning of the Permanent Petroleum Pricing Committee is in contravention of any of the laws of Trinidad and Tobago;
- (c) given that most of the LNG and petrochemical sales, cannot be strictly termed as being at "arm's length", since they are marketed by companies affiliated to the upstream producers, what measures are being utilised by the Ministry to establish and confirm the "correctness" of sale prices for these products; and
- (d) the mechanisms used to determine the true market value of the transactions at (c) above?

Question No. 48 to the Honourable Minister of Energy and Energy Affairs

- (c) whether such a practice is in line with other jurisdictions and the potential for this to hurt the ability of the State to maximise the exploration of all existing acreage; and
- (d) what action, if any is being contemplated by the Ministry to address the issues described at (b) and (c) above?

- i) Could the Minister say how many school girls who were attending primary school in each year from 2008 to 2012 gave birth?

WHEREAS conditions conducive to free, fair and transparent elections are essential to preserving Democracy;

AND WHEREAS various resources are needed to finance and support free, fair and transparent election campaigns;

AND WHEREAS the cost of financing campaigns has increased substantially over decades and sources of campaign finance are not transparent and therefore, a matter of importance to citizens;

AND WHEREAS citizens need to be satisfied that there is fairness and full disclosure with respect to transactions involving the use of public resources by elected representatives in the process of governance;

BE IT RESOLVED that Parliament appoint a Joint Select Committee to propose a legislative framework to govern the financing of election campaigns and to submit its report with recommendations to both Houses of Parliament within six months of its appointment.
