Act No. 15 of 1999

AN ACT for the incorporation of the Little Flock
Christian Mission and for matters incidental
thereto.

[Assented to 8th September, 1999]

WHEREAS there has been established in Trinidad and ^{Preamble}
Tobago, an Organisation known as the Little Flock
Christian Mission:

And whereas it is expedient that the Little Flock Christian Mission should be incorporated for the purpose of exercising the powers hereinafter set forth:

Enactment	ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as the Little Flock Christian Mission (Incorporation) Act, 1999.
Incorporation	2. The Little Flock Christian Mission (hereinafter called “The Organisation”) is hereby created a body corporate.
Aims and objects	3. The aims and objects of the Organisation are— <i>(a)</i> to promote and encourage religious, social, educational and cultural activities so as to improve knowledge, strengthen discipline, generate love, peace and unity among members and the public at large; <i>(b)</i> to give assistance to the needy and underprivileged through humanitarian services and charitable ventures; <i>(c)</i> to provide support to other Organisations with similar aims and objectives; <i>(d)</i> to assemble its members together in worship of Almighty God for mutual edification and christian fellowship in Christ Jesus.
Power of the Organisation	4. The Organisation shall have power— <i>(a)</i> to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, devise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property of any estate or interest therein; <i>(b)</i> to accept surrenders or reconveyances and to enter into contracts;

(c) to sell, exchange, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all property which may, for the time being, be vested in it, subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title.

5. All real or personal property now held by or vested ^{Transfer and vesting of property} in any person for the use and benefit of the Organisation is hereby transferred to and vested in the Organisation.

6. All documents requiring the seal of the ^{Mode of execution of documents} Organisation shall be sealed with the common seal of The Organisation in the presence of the President and General Secretary for the time being in office, or in the event of incapacity or absence from the territory of either, in the presence of some other person or persons authorised for that purpose by the Organisation who shall both sign every such document and such documents, and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Organisation.

7. (1) The Organisation shall at all times have a ^{Service of documents} fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Organisation and that address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of the date of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Organisation may be served by leaving the same at, or by sending the same by registered post, to the registered address of The Organisation.

(3) Failure to register the address and change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Organisation liable to a fine of one hundred and

twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues, after conviction thereof.

Power to make rules **8.** The Organisation may from time to time make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and the discharge of its duties, powers and functions and such rules may be amended from time to time.

Saving of State and other rights **9.** Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, or under them.
