REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 12 of 2001

[L.S.]

AN ACT to provide for the Service of Trinidad and
Tobago for the financial year ending on the
30th day of September, 2002.

[Assented to 28th September, 2001]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as Enactment
follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, Short title
2002.

Issue from the
Consolidated Fund
authorized

2. (1) The issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum of sixteen thousand, four hundred and ninety-four million, five hundred and seventy-six thousand, nine hundred and fifty-three dollars is hereby authorized for meeting expenditure for the service of the financial year ending 30th September, 2002 under the Heads of Expenditure specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The sum specified in the Schedule opposite to each Head is hereby appropriated out of the said sum of sixteen thousand, four hundred and ninety-four million, five hundred and seventy-six thousand, nine hundred and fifty-three dollars for the purpose specified in relation to that Head in the Estimates of Expenditure for the said financial year.

Commencement

3. This Act, shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 2001.
