REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 1 of 2002

AN ACT to provide for the Service of Trinidad and
Tobago for the financial year ending on the
30th day of September, 2003.

[Assented to 31st October, 2002]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as Enactment
follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, Short title
2003.

Issue from the
Consolidated Fund
authorised

2. (1) The issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum of thirteen thousand, three hundred and ninety-six million, four hundred and sixteen thousand, one hundred and seventy-five dollars is hereby authorised for meeting expenditure for the service of the financial year ending 30th September, 2003 under the Heads of Expenditure specified in the Schedule.

(2) The sum specified in the Schedule opposite to each Head is hereby appropriated out of the said sum of thirteen thousand, three hundred and ninety-six million, four hundred and sixteen thousand, one hundred and seventy-five dollars for the purpose specified in relation to that Head in the Estimates of Expenditure for the financial year ending 30th September, 2003.

Commencement

3. This Act shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 2002.
